The house at 10756 Scaggsville Road is not eligible due to the fact that it does not meet National Register Criteria A, B, C, or D. Preliminary research has not revealed any association between the dwelling and events that have made a significant contribution to the broad patterns of our history (Criterion A) or the lives of persons significant in our past (Criterion B). Vernacular in design, it is neither unusual nor distinguished; it does not represent the work of a master or display high artistic merit (Criterion C). There is no evidence that the property is likely to yield information important in history or prehistory (Criterion D). Thus, the property is not National Register-eligible.

CAPSULE SUMMARY
10756 Scaggsville Road
(HO-709)

Constructed at the turn of the twentieth century, the vernacular dwelling at 10756 Scaggsville Road was originally an T-shaped two-story, three-bay, cross gable roof residence. The house is set on a solid stone foundation, and the wood frame walls are clad in vinyl German siding. The cross gable roof is covered in standing seam sheet metal. An exterior brick chimney, laid in stretcher bond, rises at the original section of the northwest elevation, and a one-story, two-bay porch with square wood posts and a standing seam, sheet metal, shed roof extends across a portion of the facade. A large, two-story, single pile addition extended the rear ell, and a one-story, L-shaped porch with a shed roof was erected at the eastern interior corner of the southwest and northeast elevations.

The dwelling was most likely built by John H. Hines after he purchased the property in November of 1892. The property transferred to John T. and Ida Fyock Hines in 1942, upon the death of John H. Hines. The Hines family still retains ownership of 10756 Scaggsville Road.

The property at 10756 Scaggsville Road illustrates a typical farm house at the turn-of-the-century. The original house and four historic outbuildings provide a strong example of a working farm in rural Maryland during the beginning of the twentieth century.

Constructed at the turn of the century, the vernacular dwelling at 10756 Scaggsville Road was originally an T-shaped two-story, three-bay, cross gable roof residence. The house is set on a solid stone foundation, and the wood frame walls are clad in vinyl German siding. The cross gable roof is covered in standing seam sheet metal. An exterior brick chimney, laid in stretcher bond, rises at the original section of the northwest elevation, and a one-story, two-bay porch with square wood posts and a standing seam, sheet metal, shed roof extends across a portion of the facade. A large, two-story, single pile addition extended the rear ell, and a one-story, L-shaped porch with a shed roof was erected at the eastern interior corner of the southwest and northeast elevations.

The house is set on a slight rise above the road. The property is dominated to the south by mature trees, and several outbuildings stand to the east of the house. The dwelling addresses Scaggsville Road to the southwest, and a gravel drive leads from the road across the northeast edge of the property, past the main facade, provides access to the various outbuildings.

EXTERIOR DESCRIPTION:

The facade of the house is L-shaped, with a one-story two-bay porch in the corner of the "L." The main entrance to the house is situated in the center bay of the three-bay southwest elevation. This entrance is marked with a non-original, single-leaf, panel-and-light metal door. To either side of the entrance, the first story of the house is pierced with two replacement, 6/1 metal sash windows. The second story is pierced by two replacement, 6/1 metal sash windows, one in the gable end wall, one above the entrance, and one in the southeast wall within the corner of the "L."

The northwest elevation consists of the original house with the large, two-story addition to the north. The exterior brick chimney, laid in stretcher bond, rises at the north of the original section of the house. The first story of the original house is pierced by two non-original, 6/1 metal sash windows, and the second story is pierced by two non-original, 6/1 metal sash windows. The first and second stories of the addition are each pierced by a single 6/1 metal sash window.

The northeast elevation consists of the gable end of the rear ell and the rear wall of the original side gable portion of the house. On the northeast elevation, the first story of the original house is entirely covered by the one-story, L-shaped porch with a shed

roof with asphalt shingles. Beneath the porch, on the first story, is an original, single leaf, wood paneled door with lights. The first story is also pierced by one non-original, 6/1 metal sash window. The second story is pierced by one non-original, 6/1 metal sash window.

The first story of the southeast elevation is entirely covered by the one-story, L-shaped porch with an asphalt shingled shed roof. Beneath the porch, on the first story, is a salvaged, single leaf, wood paneled door with lights. The first story of this elevation is pierced by two non-original, 6/1 metal sash windows. The second story, is marked by three non-original 6/1 metal sash windows of varying sizes, two within the original rear ell, and one in the addition.

OUTBUILDINGS:

To the southeast of the main house stand two circa 1920, wood frame sheds. The larger shed is set on a stone pier foundation. It has a gable roof with metal sheathing and wood vertical board siding. The smaller shed is also set on a stone pier foundation and has a gable roof, but it clad in board and batten siding.

A large wood frame barn is located to the east of the main dwelling. The original portion of this hay barn dates to circa 1920. The original building sits on a stone foundation and has vertical board siding. The entire building is covered with a metal gable roof. A frame addition on the northeast side sits on a concrete block foundation.

A two-story concrete block barn is also located to the east of the main house. This 1950s building has a metal gable roof and allows vehicles to pass through the interior structure.

A 1930s dilapidated wood frame shed lays to the northeast of the main dwelling. The shed has board and batten siding and a gable roof.

A 1980s wood frame, machine shed is located to the north of the main building. The shed is covered with metal siding and has a gable roof.

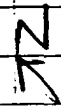

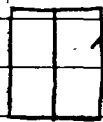
RESOURCE SKETCH MAP

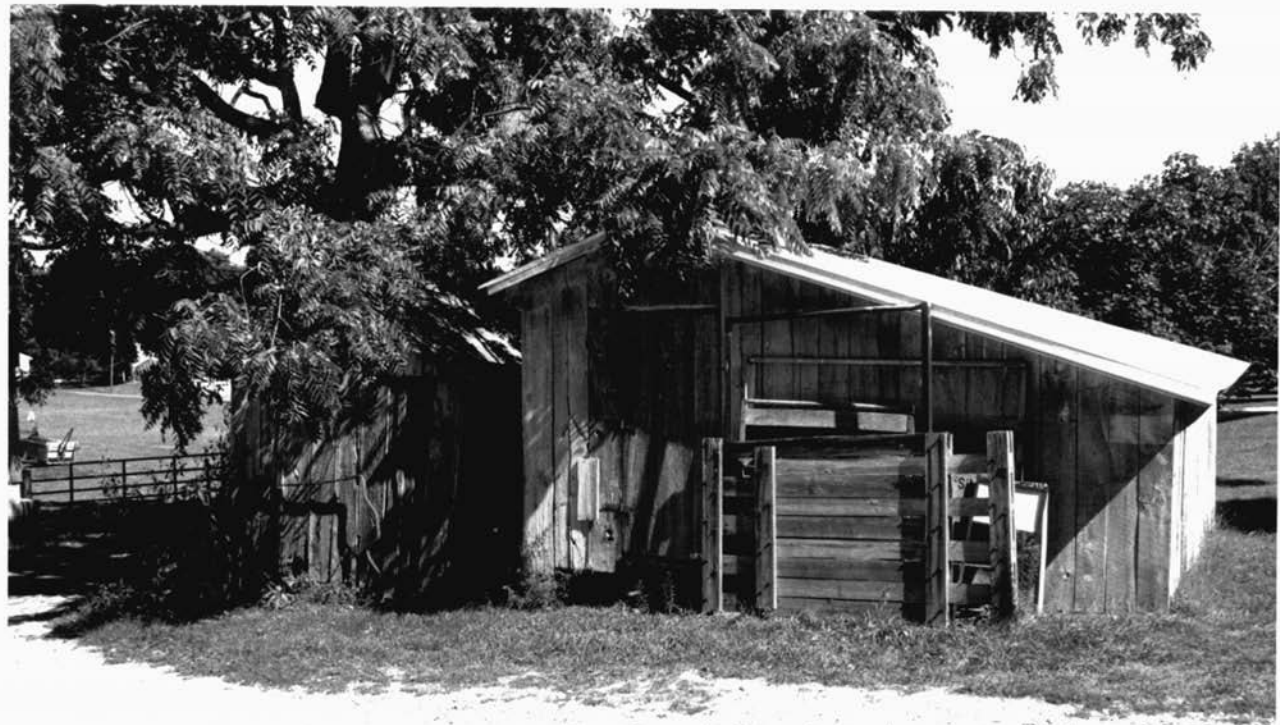
