**Capsule Summary:**

The historic district includes one contributing site, three contributing structures, seven non-contributing buildings and thirteen non-contributing structures which together form former recreational complex in use from 1930 until its formal closure in 2022. The 9.25-acre complex includes exterior parking in the north, east, and south, the stadium and ballfield at the west side of the property and associated buildings and structures ringing the south, west, and north edges of the ballfield. Until its demolition in May of 2022 the Municipal Stadium was one of the oldest surviving Minor League stadiums remaining in the United States.

The field is oriented so that the pitcher faces southwest and the batter to the northeast. A high stone and concrete block wall, painted green, encloses the ballfield on the southeast and northeast outfield sides. The stone portions of the wall are older, dating from the initial construction of the stadium, with later twentieth century modifications. Chain link fencing encloses the remainder of the field, separating the bleachers, grandstand, and concession areas from the playing field. A gravel-surfaced border forms a perimeter around the baseball field. The pitchers' bull pen is located at the east edge of the outfield, nearly directly behind the pitcher's mound. The batting cage, constructed in 1999 is at the north edge of the field. The scoreboards are along the northeast edge of the outfield wall, including both a manually operated scoreboard dating from 1984 and a digital scoreboard installed in 2011.

In addition to the ballfield and original segments of the outfield wall, surviving historic components of the Municipal Stadium include the west side bleacher structure, constructed circa 1948 or 1952, and the 1959 stonewalls bounding Town Run to the west. Although the Hagerstown Municipal Stadium Historic District has many components that are less than 50 years old, it is nevertheless historic in its role in professional baseball, both major and minor leagues, both for its early adoption of night games and its association with several baseball stars such as Willie Mays, Jim Palmer, and Bryce Harper who started their careers at Hagerstown. Although many of the buildings and structures that are part of the stadium complex are less than 50 years old they are part of the baseball complex and contribute to the feeling, association, and experience of the ballpark.

The Hagerstown Municipal Stadium occupies an approximately nine-acre site located in southeastern Hagerstown, with the street address of 274 E. Memorial Boulevard. The stadium complex occupies a triangular parcel bounded by Memorial Boulevard on the south, Eastern Boulevard on the southeast, Cannon Avenue on the northeast and Town Run, a small creek confined between stone walls on the west. The stone creek enclosure walls were constructed in 1959. The stadium fronts onto Memorial Boulevard. Municipal Stadium has occupied this site since 1930 when the ball field was first constructed and continued in use through the 2019 season. The 2020 and 2021 seasons were not held, due to the Covid-19 pandemic. The stadium closed permanently and the local baseball team, the Hagerstown Suns disbanded.

Hagerstown Municipal Stadium is recorded in this MIHP document as a historic district, because the complex includes a variety of buildings and structures that supported the baseball operation, in addition to the playing field. The stadium is scheduled for demolition, which prompted this recordation. The following physical description is based on a site visit on April 8, 2022, before demolition began. The City of Hagerstown provided the construction dates for the various components of the stadium complex. The stadium stands at the west side of the property with parking lots along the southeast and southwest portions of the tract. The field is oriented so that the pitcher faces southwest and the batter to the northeast. A slight rise in terrain places the left field at a slightly higher elevation than the rest of the field. A high stone and concrete block wall, painted green, encloses the ballfield on the southeast and northeast outfield sides. The stone portions of the wall are older, dating from initial construction of the stadium. The outfield wall was extended in height with concrete block and braced with steel buttresses in 1982. Lower portions of the wall that are concrete block date from the early 1950s. Chain link fencing encloses the remainder of the field, separating the bleachers, grandstand, and concession areas from the playing field. A gravel-surfaced border forms a perimeter around the baseball field. The pitchers' bull pen is located at the east edge of the outfield, nearly directly behind the pitcher's mound. The batting cage, constructed in 1999 is at the north edge of the field. The scoreboards are along the northeast edge of the outfield wall. There are two, a manually operated scoreboard dating from 1984 and a digital scoreboard that was installed in 2011.

In addition to the playing field, another historic component of Municipal Stadium is the west side bleacher structure, which was constructed circa 1948 or 1952. The bleachers are constructed of steel posts and beams, rising in height to elevate the seating. Chain link fencing encloses the structure. The bench seats are metal. A metal pipe railing separates the first two rows of seating from the rest of the bleachers. The first two rows have full seats rather than backless benches used for the remainder of the bleachers and are reserved as VIP seating. The playing field, outfield wall, west bleachers and the Town Run walls are the historic components of Hagerstown's Municipal Stadium. The remaining structures and buildings date from the 1980s and later, most recently 2011, and reflect the continuing use of the stadium for minor league baseball for 90 years.

The stadium's main entrance is from the parking lot along Memorial Boulevard. The City of Hagerstown constructed a new entrance plaza in 2005. It includes the entrance kiosk for ticket purchase and information. The entrance kiosk is a one-story rectangular building constructed of rock-faced concrete block with a snap-joint standing seam hipped roof. The roof overhangs at each end of the building, supported with concrete block columns. The overhang shelters the ticket windows. Just to the west of the entrance kiosk is a larger one-story hip-roofed building, of rock-faced concrete block construction, which served as the Team Store.

Patrons accessed the stadium through a gate just to the northeast of the entrance plaza. Immediately to the west of the entrance gate is a covered grandstand. It wraps around the west end of the field, immediately behind home plate. Atop the central section of the grandstand is a shed-roofed frame press box with an adjoining open deck. A set of spiral metal stairs lead to the press box from the back of the grandstand. The grandstand and press box were constructed in 1983. The grandstand is supported with steel columns and has metal decking stepping upward with 12 rows of fold-down chair type seating separated into three sections. Metal pipe hand railing runs up the center of each aisle of steps providing access to the rows of seats. Chain link fencing encloses the sides and back of the grandstand, and netting covers the front to protect occupants from foul balls.

To the east of the main entrance is a second set of bleachers constructed in 1987. Like the older west side bleachers, this structure has three rows of VIP seating at the front, field-side length of the bleacher structure. Situated immediately east of the south side bleachers is a rectangular one-story hipped roof building constructed of rock-faced concrete block, which was built in 1992. It houses the team offices, clubhouse, and locker rooms.

A secondary entrance to the ballpark is located at the north end of the stadium, accessed from a small parking lot off Cannon Avenue. A ticket booth for this entrance is a concrete block shed-roofed extension from the stadium wall. It appears to date from approximately 1980. South of this entrance, between the left field wall and Town Run are various service and concession buildings and structures. Immediately south of the north entrance ticketing area is a concrete block storage building with roll-up garage type doors, that dates from 1984. Next, to the southwest, is a Beer Garden with an elevated wood deck and rows of wood picnic tables. The beer garden was installed in 1992. To the southwest of the beer garden is a one story, hip-roofed concrete block kitchen and food service building. To the west of the kitchen building is a one-story concrete block building with a hipped roof containing restrooms.

Lighting for night games is an important part of the stadium's components. Tall galvanized tapered metal poles tower above the field, spaced at regular intervals. The poles have projecting spikes on either side to allow service personnel to climb to the top to change bulbs and perform other maintenance work. At the top of the poles there is a small catwalk for access to the twelve lamps atop each pole.

Although not used since 2019, the stadium appeared at the time of the site visit to be in good condition. The municipal stadium, however, has through its history been prone to flooding from Town Run and the Marsh Run along Memorial Boulevard.

### Property History

The City of Hagerstown acquired 8.43 acres of the present 9.25 acre site in 1927 with the purchase of the former Rowland property (liber 177, folio 286). The remaining property was acquired from the William Bester estate prior to March 1930 (Hagerstown *Morning Herald* March 18, 1930). The initial plans laid out by the J. B. Ferguson Company (Hagerstown *Morning Herald* February 27, 1930), called for a stadium with an 1800 seating capacity, with a ball field surrounded by a running track (possibly never constructed), and sufficient acreage to permit use for "football, soccer, and all other outdoor sports. (Hagerstown *Morning Herald* March 18, 1930)." It also proposed eventual improvements for tennis courts and playground implements, however these latter elements do not appear to have ever been built. Funding for the project was raised by the Hagerstown Athletic Field Association and several local funding raising drives, such as the "Buy-a-Board" effort. The original complex was constructed in six short weeks in the spring of 1930, and opening night was held May 8, 1930 when the Hagerstown Hubs of the Blue Ridge League played Frederick (Hagerstown *Morning Herald* May 8, 1930). Later, in July of 1930 the City announced the intention to install lighting for night games, and the first night game at Hagerstown was held at the stadium August 12, 1930 under lights supplied and installed by the American Daylight Floodlighting Company (Hagerstown *Daily Mail*, August 12, 1930).

Maintenance appears to have been an issue during the Depression years, and by 1938, the stadium complex was in sufficient disrepair that it was approved for renovation under Work Program Administration (WPA) funding (Hagerstown *Daily Mail*, March 4, 1938). The program called for "...completing the grading inside the park, repairing and painting the fences, and putting the night lighting system in first class condition (Hagerstown *Daily Mail*, March 4, 1938)." When completed in April of 1939, the final WPA work included rebuilding the fence around the field, including moving both the right and left field fences to locations roughly 300 feet from home base, improving and painting the grandstand, and grading work in the outfield (Hagerstown *Daily Mail*, April 22, 1939).

By 1948, there was again talk of rebuilding the stadium (context indicates this refers primarily to the grandstand and bleachers) (Hagerstown *Morning Herald* June 12, 1948). It is possible that the westside bleachers date from this period, but it seems more likely that they date from 1952 (Hagerstown *Daily Mail*, April 15, 1952). In general, a number of improvements were made in the early 1950s, including improvements to the infield with soils brought from Montgomery County, construction of a new clubhouse,

and new lights (Hagerstown *Daily Mail*, March 12, 1954). Stonewalls were added along Town Run in 1959 to help control seasonal flooding which impacted to the stadium fields (City of Hagerstown, personal communication 2022).

Sometime prior to 1970 a fire at the stadium destroyed a number of earlier features, including the earlier grandstand facilities. A 1970 review by the National Association of Professional Baseball Leagues concluded that the Municipal Stadium facilities at that time were inadequate to support a Minor League team, citing the lack of grandstand, poor concession facilities and inadequate restroom provisions (Hagerstown *Morning Herald* November 4, 1970). Minor League baseball would not return to the stadium until 1981, and a series of improvements and renovations took place across the early and mid-1980s, with a second program in the mid-1990s. Although the stadium continued to host professional and amateur baseball up until 2019, it never recovered prominence in the regional baseball system. After two years of Covid restriction (2020 and 2021) the stadium was closed. The complex was demolished in May 2022.

An important draw at the stadium were Minor League games for the Hagerstown Hubs (Blue Ridge League (1930), the Middle Atlantic League (1931) and the Interstate League 1941), the Hagerstown Owls (Interstate League 1941–1949, the Hagerstown Braves (Interstate League 1950–1952 and the Piedmont League 1953), the Hagerstown Packets of the Piedmont League (1954–1955), and finally the Hagerstown Suns (the Carolina League (1981–1988), the Eastern League (1989–1992), and the South Atlantic League (1993–2020). A small number of Negro League games were also hosted at the stadium although they do not appear to have ever been a regular offering. And throughout the 1930s, later 1940s, 1950s, and 1950s the stadium was the site of fiercely contested local amateur leagues. After the mid-1960s national and possible local spectator focus appears to have shifted not just football over baseball, but also to Major League over Minor League. Fewer reports of local games appear in the Hagerstown papers, but this may have been a function of reporting rather than actual participation and attendance.

A sampling of the local newspaper entries through the 1930s, 1940s, and 1950s documented the wide range of events the stadium hosted and its important role as a center of community interaction. The stadium played hosts to local and occasional national events, including high school baseball, local amateur baseball leagues fielded by businesses and local entities, high school football games, boxing and wrestling matches, music concerts, and even the occasional dog show and auto show. The 1988 US baseball team play at exhibition game at the stadium prior to the Olympic Games (Bob Savitt, personal communication, 2022).

Although the Hagerstown Municipal Stadium Historic District has many components that are less than 50 years old, it is nevertheless significant under National Register Criteria A and C. The stadium was one of the first in professional baseball, both major and minor leagues, to offer night baseball, and several baseball stars such as Willie Mays, Jim Palmer, and Bryce Harper played at Hagerstown during their early careers. The design of the field with its unusual slightly elevated left field is an original feature of the stadium, dating from 1930. Portions of the original outfield wall were also intact at the time of this recordation. The west bleachers structure dating from the 1940s is another historic component of the stadium complex, along with the walls along Town Run. Although many of the buildings and structures that are part of the stadium complex are less than 50 years old and therefore labeled as non-contributing, they are part of the baseball complex and contribute to the feeling, association, and experience of the ballpark.

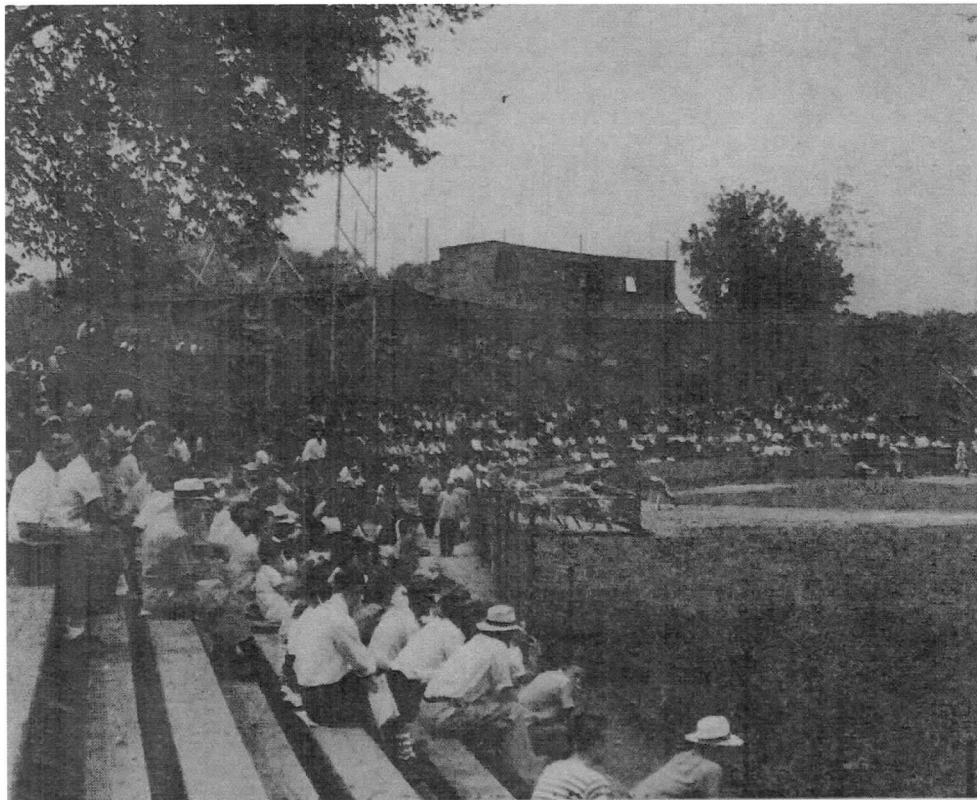

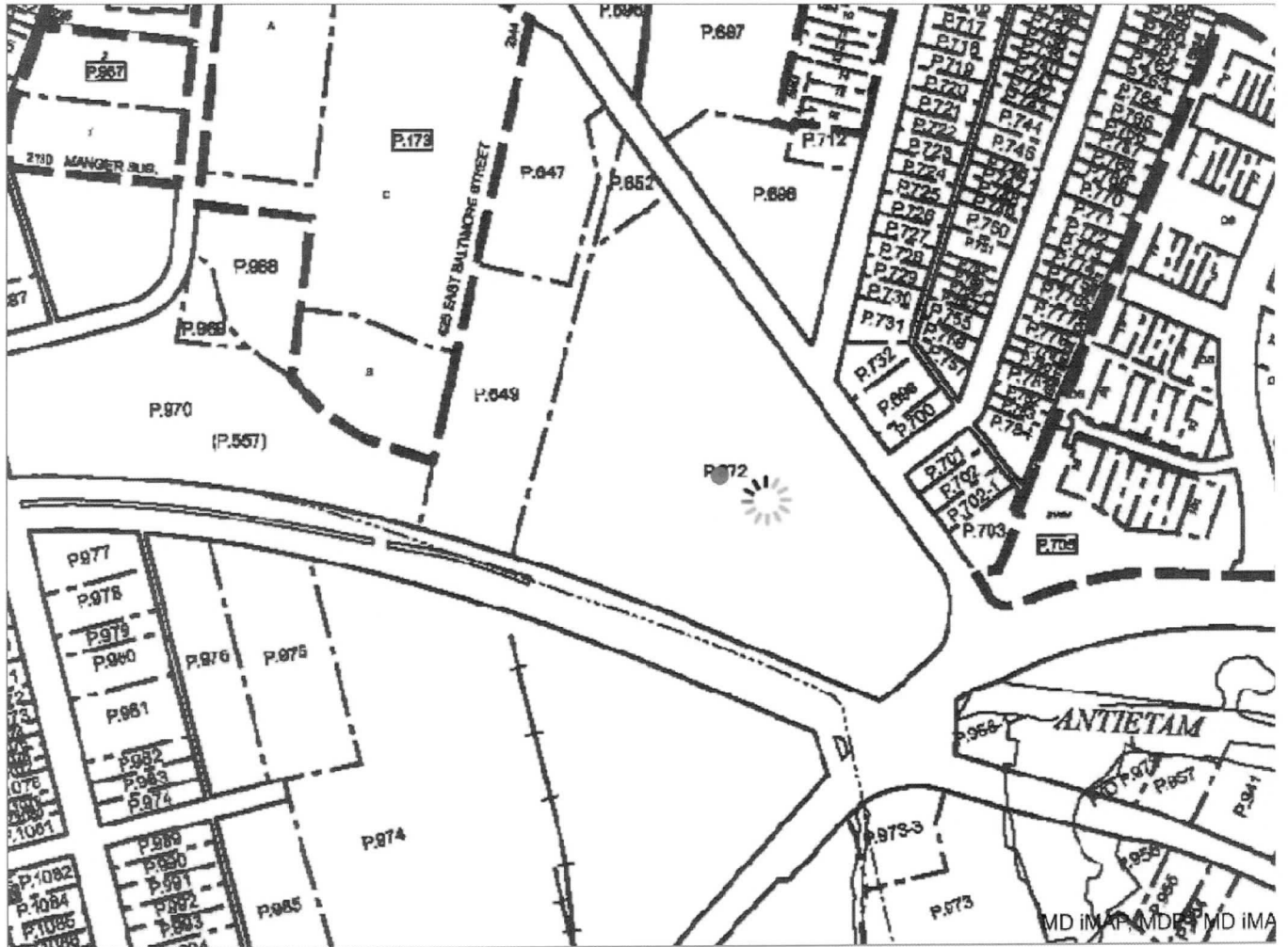

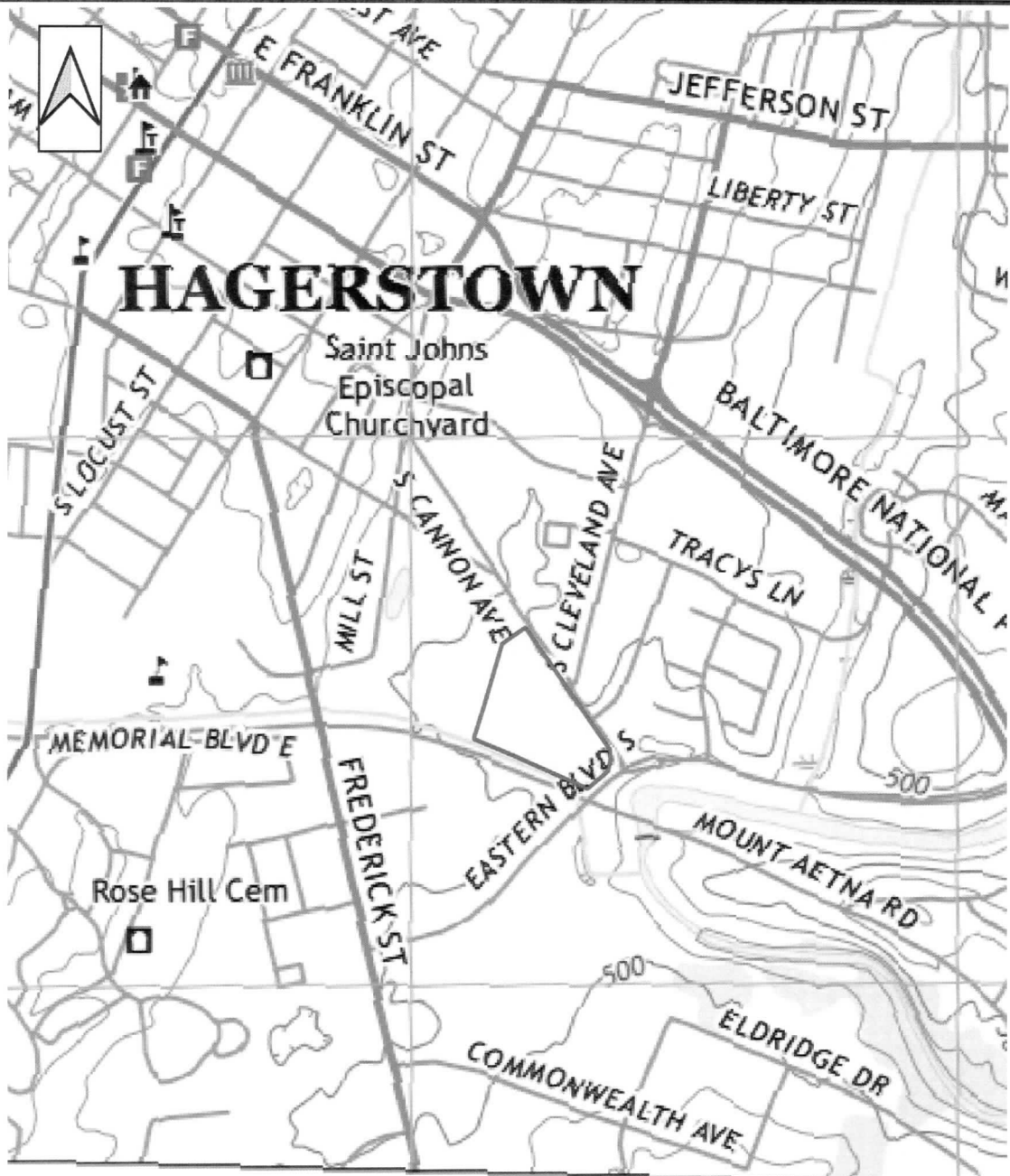

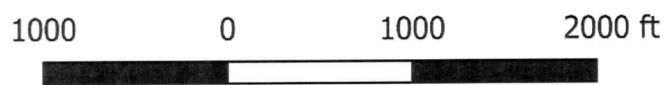

SDAT Parcel Map



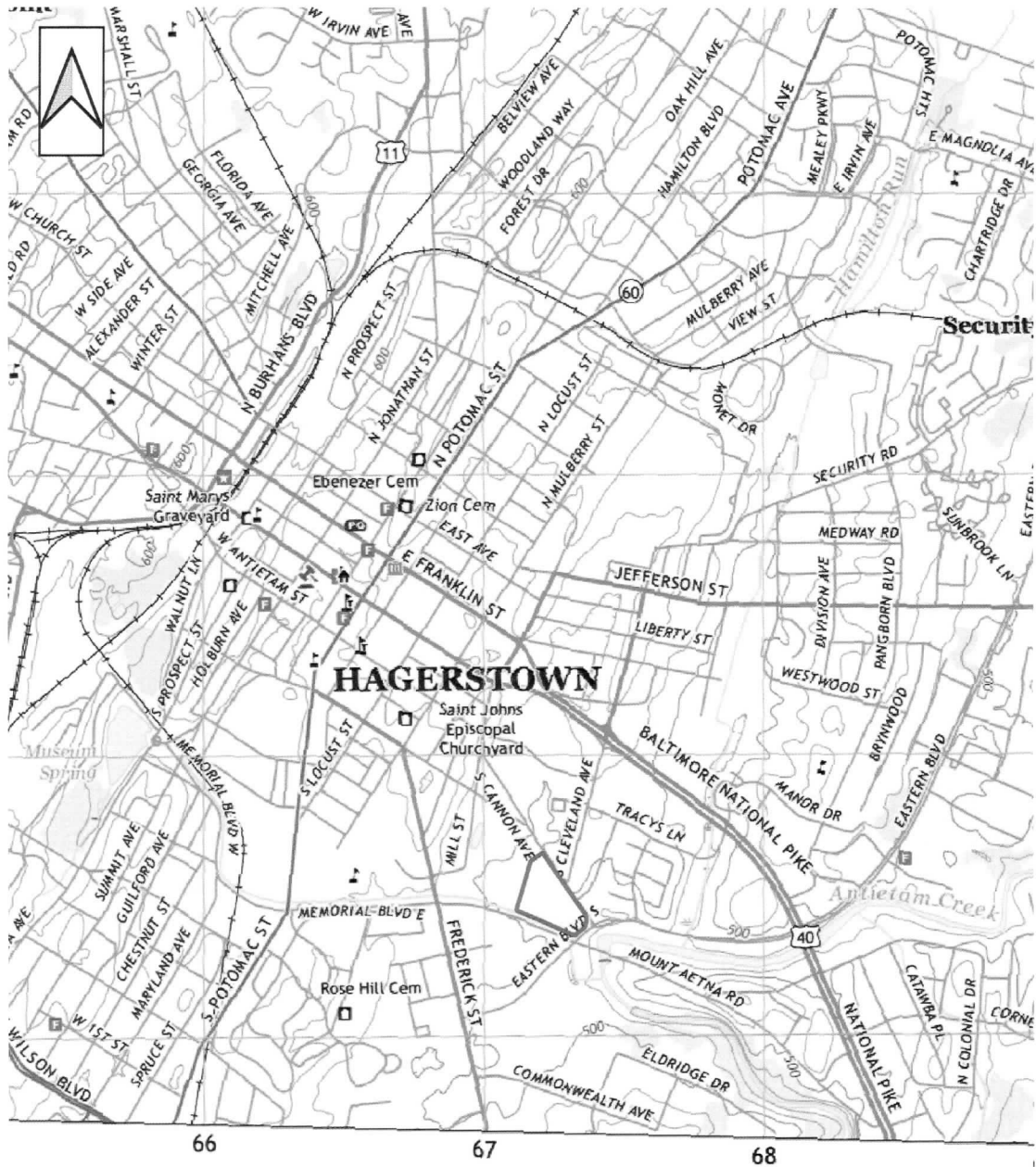
