Summary Description:

The Reynolds Tavern Site (18AP23) consists of the archeological remains associated with an 18th-20th century tavern structure and stable in downtown Annapolis. This Georgian brick structure was built circa 1747 and has served as a tavern, livery stable, bank, city library, hotel, and private residence over the course of its history. It is prominently sited at 4 Church Circle in the heart of the National Historic Landmark of Annapolis. The surrounding landscape is heavily developed as an urban area. Soils at the site are Collington and Wist sandy loams as well as some human transported soils.

The 2 ½ storey brick building (MHP# AA-402) at 4 Church Circle was constructed circa 1747 as a dwelling and hat shop. During its tenure as the Beaver and Lac'd Hat tavern in the 18th century, the building hosted meetings of the Corporation of the City of Annapolis and the Mayor's Court. In 1812, the building was conveyed to the newly established Farmer's Bank of Maryland, the first banking institution chartered in Annapolis and the first bank in the nation to pay interest on deposits. The former tavern was used first as a banking hall, and then as the home of the Cashier of the Bank for nearly 125 years. Threatened with demolition, the building was purchased in 1936 by prominent members of Annapolis' preservation society for use as the city library. In 1974, Reynolds Tavern was transferred to the National Trust for Historic Preservation, and by the 1980s, had returned to one of its original uses as a tavern. The property also includes a rare 18th century brick smokehouse.

The only documented archeological work to be carried out at 18AP23 occurred over the summer of 1978. By 1974, the Annapolis Public Library, which had been operating out of the building, had outgrown the structure and it was transferred to the National Trust for Historic Preservation (NTHP). The NTHP, then, leased the property to the Historic Annapolis Foundation. In 1978, the Historic Annapolis Foundation requested that an archeological excavation be conducted prior to planned renovations. The excavations centered on finding out how the original tavern was constructed and what changes were made through the years to aide in appropriate restoration.

Fourteen trenches and three 1.524 X 1.524 m (5 X 5 ft) test units were excavated at the site in 1978. It was estimated that approximately 41.8 m² (450 ft²) of soil was moved during the course of the excavations. Most of the soil that was removed was sifted through ¼ and ½ inch hardware mesh. Most brick or stones in course were left in situ.

Over 1700 artifact fragments came from some 15 cultural layers or strata encountered across the site and from 10 identified features. Features included a thin shell lens thought to have been the original grade of the property, earth and brick stoops, whitewashed brick walls, and an oyster shell-filled trench with a cover that served as a gutter. The artifacts consisted of construction materials such as brick and stone fragments, mortar, cement, slate, nails, shell, and iron objects used in the construction of the house, and midden debris (fragments of broken dishes and glass, pipe fragments, animal bones, fruit seeds), door keys, pins, buttons, wire, and a coin from 1773 (George III half-penny). Artifact complexes were recognized for the middle of the 18th century, the early 19th century, and the 2nd quarter of the 20th century.

No catalog is provided of the artifacts recovered, so the artifacts are accounted above simply as 1700 miscellaneous objects.

Based on these findings it was determined that the remainder of Site 18AP23 had tremendous potential to yield additional intact features and deposits. Intensive archeological survey was recommended in the backyard area if additional renovations were to be undertaken or additional data is needed for interpretation. No additional archeological work has been documented since that time, and the site should still be regarded as a significant resource.
