## Summary Description:

Warfield Prehistoric Site #1 is a prehistoric lithic scatter on the property of the Springfield State Hospital in Sykesville, Carroll County. The site is situated in the floodplain of a channelized tributary of Piney Run. It is believed that the basic contours of the site area are natural, although it now resides well below artificially elevated roads to the north and east, and the former location of a building related to the State Hospital to the northwest. Soils at the site are Baile silt loams.

The first documented archeological fieldwork at the site occurred in 2004. Phase I and Phase II archeological work was carried out by MHT personnel on the "southern tract" of the Springfield State Hospital property. Phase I survey was carried out on the entire 97 acre property, while Phase II assessments were undertaken for all 3 archeological resources that were identified during Phase I, including at 18CR255. The Town of Sykesville received ownership of this formerly State-owned property conditioned upon the full consideration of historic and archeological resources, in compliance with Article 83B §5-618(d) of the Annotated Code of Maryland. The Town of Sykesville entered into a Memorandum of Agreement with the Maryland Historical Trust to accomplish an inventory and assessment of archeological resources that might be affected by planned re-development of the property.

Phase I work in the vicinity of 18CR255 entailed the excavation of shovel test pits (STPs) at 30 m intervals in most areas where slope was gentle enough to permit their use. Each STP was a minimum of 30 cm in diameter and was hand-excavated to subsoil. All removed soils were screened through hardware cloth. Records for each STP included, at a minimum, notes with locational information, stratigraphic/profile information, depth, and material recovered.

A total of 17 initial STPs were excavated between the aforementioned raised grade boundaries created by extant roads and other features. Two STPs produced prehistoric lithics, but only one was recognized in the field. Upon the discovery of additional flakes in the laboratory, researchers returned to the site to carry out Phase II testing.

Phase II work began with the excavation of 8 supplemental STPs excavated on a 5 m interval within the extant grid surrounding positive finds. Only two of the supplemental STPs produced additional artifacts. The full artifacts collection from Phase I and Phase II work at 18CR255 consisted of a smoky quartz biface fragment, 5 flakes, a lightbulb fragment and a piece of window glass.

Based on the meager findings from the supplemental shovel testing, no additional Phase II work was carried out at 18CR255. The site appears to represent a lithic reduction station of short duration at some unknown prehistoric time. The concentration of materials is of very low density and is considered to have little research potential. It was not recommended for listing on the NRHP.
