Summary Description:

The Monocacy Bottom I Site (18FR618) is situated on the edge of a level, slightly elevated, terrace-like bench near a tributary creek of the Monocacy River in Frederick County, MD. It is an apparent Late Archaic quartz quarrying and processing station that may be related in some way to the nearby Monocacy Bottom II site (18FR617). Soils at the site are dominated by the Athol series.

The site was first identified during a Phase I survey in 1988. This study was undertaken in advance of the construction of a 22.5 km long, 15.2 m wide section of the BG&E natural gas pipeline right-of-way. On completion of the survey, 14 new prehistoric aboriginal archeological sites and 2 previously recorded sites were identified within the project right-of-way. The methods employed included background library research, surface collection, and shovel testing. Most of the sites represented small temporary encampments exemplified by scatters of lithic debitage. At Monocacy Bottom I the Phase I survey consisted of a surface collection following plowing, disking, and rainwashing of the level field. A number of artifacts were recovered including a rhyolite side-notched Brewerton-like point base, typical of the Late Archaic period. All of the Phase I artifacts are included in the count below.

After a review of the sites identified during the Phase I Survey, Phase II archeological testing was recommended to ascertain National Register eligibility on the three sites which demonstrated a frequency of diagnostic artifacts with potential to contribute to culturally significant data (18FR618 among them). The site was again plowed, disked, and rainwashed to remove a crop of corn which had been planted. Each artifact was piece plotted to its exact location and transferred to a map to examine artifact distributions and concentrations. Most of the artifacts were confined to a small area within the pipeline corridor. Of particular note, this site was situated near a small outcropping of quartz located only ca. 20 meters to the north and at the edge of the plowed field. During Phase II work, three trenches (measuring 1.8 X 30 meter each) were mechanically excavated within the pipeline right-of-way. These trenches, covering an area of 162 square meters, constituted a 21% sample of that portion of the site which was situated within the pipeline right-of-way.

No features were found in the undisturbed subsoil below the plowzone, nor were any artifacts recovered in the trenches. The artifact sample recovered during piece plotting consisted of lithic debitage; no diagnostic material was collected beyond that found during the Phase I survey. A total of 56 prehistoric artifacts were recovered during all phases of research at Monocacy Bottom I. The assemblage consists of 1 rhyolite point fragment (the Brewerton), 2 quartz and 2 rhyolite bifaces/fragments, 1 utilized/retouched quartz flake, 5 quartz and 9 rhyolite primary flakes, 2 quartz and 2 rhyolite secondary flakes, 3 quartz cores, 24 modified quartz chunks, 4 quartz and 1 rhyolite unmodified chunks/blocks.

This site was interpreted as an activity area associated with Site 18FR617 where quartz was being reduced into cores and blanks. Numerous quartz boulders were observed on the terrace where the site was situated, and they may have been from a lithic outcropping which was used during prehistoric times. The lack of cultural features reflects the temporary nature of the activities undertaken in this part of the terrace. If the site is an activity area, the final stages of manufacturing and other site activities probably took place elsewhere on the terrace. Based on the lack of diagnostic and datable information gathered during the Phase I survey and Phase II testing, Site 18FR618 was not considered NRHP eligible.
