## Summary Description:

Huang Prehistoric Lithic Scatter #2 (18MO373) is a prehistoric lithic scatter dispersed over level to gently sloping agricultural land east of the Potomac River in Montgomery County, Maryland. The site is situated near the community of Poolesville. There are no sources of fresh water within a distance of 300 meters of the site. Soils at the site are grouped under the Penn-Lewisberry soil association.

The site was first identified during a Phase I survey for the planned Montgomery County Site 2 Landfill. This study was conducted in 1991 as part of the county's transition from a traditional landfill-centered waste disposal system to a waste-to-energy based program. Currently, Montgomery County disposes of their waste by burning it at extremely high temperatures, and then using the heat to generate energy as either electricity or steam. This reduces the volume of the trash by nearly 90% leaving only ash and metals. The metals are then removed via a magnet and recycled reducing waste further. Currently the ash waste is shipped by rail out-of-county for disposal in landfills. However, in 1991, as the county's extant Oaks landfill built in 1982 was nearing the end of its use-life, plans for the disposal of the ash that would be generated in the new plant led to the purchase of a large tract (including Site 18MO373) for the construction of a new landfill. While this landfill has still not been constructed, the Montgomery County governments purchased the needed property for the landfill's eventual construction and currently lease it for tenant farming. All archeological research was conducted in anticipation of state permitting and possible Army Corps of Engineers wetlands permitting that will eventually be required whenever the construction project is realized.

Following its initial discovery, the site was investigated by non-systematic surface search and collection of a sample of the artifacts that were present. The site appeared to be a diffuse scatter of prehistoric lithic artifacts dispersed over an area measuring about 110 meters by 37 meters. The observed density of artifacts was about one per five square meters. The material collected during Phase I survey consisted of a bifacially worked quartz flake, 1 rhyolite debitage flake, and a fragment of shattered quartz. No chronologically diagnostic artifacts were observed during the surface inspection. This cultural deposit appears to be the remains of a small habitation camp or subsistence station at which tool manufacture or maintenance took place. Further study of this site was required to identify its content, integrity, and boundaries and to interpret its chronology and function.

Researchers returned to the site in 1993 to conduct Phase II testing. The testing began with a systematic surface collection. Visibility was good in the eastern part of the site where the ground had been plowed. The site's western portion was in a sod farm field where visibility was good only at places where bare earth was exposed by on-going sod harvesting activities. The surface survey resulted in the collection of one non-diagnostic rhyolite projectile point fragment that generally resembled types dating to the Archaic period. The other surface finds consisted of 2 quartz biface tool fragments and four debitage fragments (1 quartzite, 3 quartz).

The surface survey was followed by the excavation of 15 shovel test pits (STPs) spaced systematically at 15 meter intervals on terrain that had produced surface finds. STPs were no less than 30 cm in diameter and were excavated to the depth of natural subsoil by natural/cultural levels. None of those STPs encountered any artifacts. One 2 X 2 meter excavation unit was excavated at a surface find location. The 2 X 2 was excavated by natural/cultural levels. All soils (both STPs and the excavation unit) were screened through hardware cloth, however, no artifacts were found. Subsequent to excavations, additional non-systematic surface searches were conducted where on-going sod harvesting exposed bare earth ground surface. That work resulted in the recovery of three widely dispersed projectile points. Two were non-diagnostic Archaic-like rhyolite points (both broken in two). The other was an intact quartz corner-notched point that resembled the Early Woodland period "Potts" type.

A total of ten prehistoric artifacts and 3 historic period artifacts (2 spent bullets and a corroded iron farm machine fitting) were recovered from 18MO373 during the Phase II study. Their wide dispersion and low density is evidence for ephemeral activities during multiple episodes of prehistory. The site's dating appears to include both Archaic and Woodland times, and the several projectile point and biface (cutting) artifacts indicate hunting and butchering practices involving the taking of game animals. No artifact concentrations of archeological interest or intact undisturbed cultural features were encountered. Site 18MO373 does not contain archeological information of significance to Maryland prehistory.
