Summary Description:

Site 18MO382 is a dispersed scatter of historic period artifacts located in an agricultural field near Poolesville in Montgomery County, Maryland. The site extends parallel with an east-west farm lane that traverses the southern edge of an agricultural field. There is an intermittent stream valley south of the farm lane. That watercourse has been dammed to form a small pond. Soils at the site are grouped under the Penn-Lewisberry soil association.

The site was first identified during a Phase I survey for the planned Montgomery County Site 2 Landfill. This study was conducted in 1991 as part of the county's transition from a traditional landfill-centered waste disposal system to a waste-to-energy based program. Currently, Montgomery County disposes of their waste by burning it at extremely high temperatures, and then using the heat to generate energy as either electricity or steam. This reduces the volume of the trash by nearly 90% leaving only ash and metals. The metals are then removed via a magnet and recycled reducing waste further. Currently the ash waste is shipped by rail out-of-county for disposal in landfills. However, in 1991, as the county's extant Oaks landfill built in 1982 was nearing the end of its use-life, plans for the disposal of the ash that would be generated in the new plant led to the purchase of a large tract (including Site 18MO382) for the construction of a new landfill. While this landfill has still not been constructed, the Montgomery County governments purchased the needed property for the landfill's eventual construction and currently lease it for tenant farming. All archeological research was conducted in anticipation of state permitting and possible Army Corps of Engineers wetlands permitting that will eventually be required whenever the construction project is realized.

Following its initial discovery, the site was investigated by non-systematic surface search and collection of a sample of artifacts encountered. It was found to consist of a scatter of artifacts over an area of about 110 meters by 15 meters. The density of surface artifacts was light, with an observed frequency of about one artifact per square meter. The artifacts collected during the Phase I survey include 2 whiteware sherds, 2 earthenware sherds, 2 bottle glass fragments, and 2 pieces of oyster shell. The artifacts indicate that this site contains refuse from 19th century agricultural and/or residential activity in the vicinity. Phase II testing was recommended to examine the deposit in greater detail.

Researchers returned to the site in 1993 to conduct the Phase II testing. Research began with a systematic surface inspection and collection using transects at 7.5 meter intervals. Visibility was good because the agricultural field had been recently plowed. The surface collection work was followed by the excavation of 12 shovel test pits (STPs) spaced systematically at 15 meter intervals along a transect that paralleled the farm lane. STPs were no less than 30 cm in diameter and were excavated to the depth of natural subsoil by natural/cultural levels. One 2 X 2 meter test unit was excavated. The test excavation unit was also dug by natural/cultural levels. All soils (both STPs and the excavation unit) were screened through hardware cloth.

All of the subsurface artifacts recovered came from the plowzone and nearly all of them were recovered from the farm lane and the terrain immediately adjacent to it. Historic period artifacts from the site include 1 activity item (draft animal hardware), 5 architectural artifacts (1 brick, 1 piece of slate, and 3 window glass fragments), 43 kitchen-related artifacts (12 redware, 23 whiteware, 1 gray stoneware, 3 pre-1870 bottle glass fragments, 2 post-1870 bottle glass fragments, and 2 pieces of shell), 1 arms object (a shotgun shell), and 7 miscellaneous objects (1 piece of coal, 5 burnt objects, & 1 piece of ferrous metal). In addition to the historic period artifact recovered from 18MO382, 20 prehistoric lithic artifacts were also found. These included 2 projectile points (a Piscataway point and an Archaic fishtail), 1 point fragment, 1 biface, 1 core fragment, 1 utilized flake, 5 debitage flakes, and 9 pieces of shatter. Most of the material was quartz, but some was rhyolite. This material was dispersed along the terrain paralleling the watercourse south of the farm lane. The dispersion and scarcity of the artifacts increased with distance from the intermittent stream. All of the material was recovered from the disturbed context of an agricultural field and no potentially significant prehistoric deposits were encountered.

The historic period cultural deposit at 18MO382 consists of a scatter of refuse associated with 19th and 20th century agricultural activity on the nearby Chiswell Farm (see synopsis report for 18MO379). The concentration of material along the farm lane is interpreted as representing the use of the roadway as a route of movement providing access to the adjoining agricultural field as well as others in the vicinity. It is not considered historically significant.
