Project Justification:

This report describes Phase II investigations at 18AN511, a 19th and 20th century domestic structure first identified in 1980. The 2006 Phase II work was carried out in accordance with provisions of the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969, the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966, as amended, and the Archaeological Resources Protection Act of 1979, which state that federally funded, licensed, or approved undertakings must assess their effects on significant cultural resources. The provisions of these acts were triggered by the application for a Surface Mining permit which would impact the site.

Project Objectives:

- Evaluate the eligibility of the site for listing on the NRHP for its potential to provide important information about the past.
- Develop appropriate recommendations for management of the site.

Research Potential:

Phase II excavation at 18AN511 produced an assemblage of some 3,830 artifacts, the vast majority of which was architectural debris. Most of the artifacts were also 20th century in origin. Little evidence appears to remain of the 19th century occupation of the site and it is unlikely that further investigation of the site would provide significant information concerning life in the past. As such, the site has been recommended as ineligible for listing on the NRHP. No further archeological investigation at 18AN511 is recommended.
