The ROW was approximately 8 miles in length and 91.44 m (300 ft) wide. The work was conducted to comply with federal and state laws such as the NHPA.

The site was initially identified in 1975 by an amateur archeologist and subsequently examined by staff of the Maryland Geological Survey, Division of Archeology. This study was conducted by members of the Potomac River Archeology Survey, when they received authorization from a development corporation to test the site, which would be destroyed by proposed construction.
