Phase I	Project Justification: In late June through early August of 1989, the Potomac River Archeology Survey (PRAS) conducted Phase I and II archeological reconnaissance in the area of the (then) proposed Patuxent River Estates. The survey was a condition of sub-division approval under Article 26, Title 3-109 of the Anne Arundel County Subdivision Regulations. The survey was conducted in response to the developer's request to provide information on the presence of possible historic and prehistoric cultural resources located in the area. These excavations indicated the presence of a Late Archaic III-V component (2200-1500 BC) in the area of proposed streets and single family homes. Based on these results and the opinion of the Anne Arundel County Archeologist, it was recommended that Phase III excavations be conducted to mitigate the impact of construction.

Project Objectives: -Mitigate the impact of construction on the significant archeological resources present on the site. -Further determine the site function, site size, vertical and horizontal integrity, and cultural affiliation. -Recover a representative sample of artifacts from the site.

Research Potential:

Sites 18AN57 and 18AN58 were ultimately determined to be two portions of a single site, the Katcef Site. Phase III work at Katcef clearly demonstrated that this site is significant not only for Anne Arundel County archeology, but also for all of Maryland archeology as well. The fact that the northern boundaries of the site are not well established, suggests that intact portions of the site may be preserved to the north and in areas that were not impact by the housing construction of the 1990s. The site should still be considered a significant archeological resource.

Phase I <input checked="" type="checkbox"/>	Project Justification: Anne Arundel County archaeologists with the Office of Planning and Zoning Cultural Resources Section completed a year-long project to enhance stewardship of the Robert Ogle collection. Ogle's collection, donated to the County in 2009, consists of 176 boxes of artifacts collected over 50 years from central and southern Maryland. It also included annotated quadrangle maps, notebooks, and photographs linking collections to known archaeological sites. The collection was composed predominantly of Native artifacts, but included colonial and 19th century materials from notable sites.

Project Objectives: Preliminary assessments had demonstrated this to be one of the most significant research collections available in Maryland, once fully curated and cataloged, and will contribute greatly to understanding archaeological resources across a broad area. At the conclusion of the project, 150 Hollinger boxes of material were processed and cataloged representing 154 separate archaeological sites, 30 of which had never been recorded with MHT prior to this project, containing over 160,000 artifacts.
