Phase I	<input checked="" type="checkbox"/>	Project Justification: Applied Archaeology and History Associates, Inc. conducted Phase I and II archaeological investigations of Development Master Plan Phases 1b and 2 of Fort Smallwood Park in order to provide information concerning cultural resources within the property. These investigations were undertaken in compliance with Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act and Sections 5A-325 and 5A-326 of the Maryland State Finance and Procurement Article to assess its potential effects on historic properties. It is understood that the planned development of the park will be funded by the Maryland Department of Natural Resources' Waterway Improvement Fund and will require a joint wetland alteration permit from the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and the Maryland Department of the Environment.

Project Objectives: The Phase I cultural resources survey of Development Master Plan Phases 1b and 2 of Fort Smallwood Park resulted in the determination that six of the park's structures are eligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places but that the park does not qualify as a National Register District. As the current master plan for the park proposes no adverse effects for any of the standing structures, no additional investigation/ documentation was recommended. This investigation also resulted in the identification of four archaeological sites: Fort Smallwood D (18AN1493), Fort Smallwood E (18AN1494), Fort Smallwood F (18AN1495), and Fort Smallwood G (18AN1496). Additional archaeological investigation was recommended for all four sites should preservation in place not be possible. As the current master plan for the park proposes partial disturbance within three of the four sites, Phase II archaeological evaluation investigations of these sites were conducted.
