Phase II <input checked="" type="checkbox"/>	This report describes the findings of a testing program at the Paca House and Garden, 186 Prince George Street in Annapolis. The work was requested by Historic Annapolis, Inc., the property owners, for the purpose of providing data for use in reconstructing the interior of the spring house and Pavilion house. The site of the former had been located and the exterior reconstructed, but the location of the latter was still unknown. The Paca House and Garden was declared a National Historic Landmark in 1972.

Phase II <input checked="" type="checkbox"/>	This report describes the findings of a testing program at the Paca House and Garden, 186 Prince George Street in Annapolis in July of 1990. The work was conducted in conjunction with the reconstruction of the garden canal and the placement of drain pipes in the garden's lower fall.
Phase III	

Project Objectives:
-Determine whether any intact 18th century surfaces have survived in the area to be impacted.
-Form a comprehensive interpretation of the archeology of this portion of the Paca garden by comparing earlier archeological profile maps with the results of fieldwork.

Research Potential:

Although 18AP1 has been the subject of several episodes of archeology, most have been poorly documented. The site maps, notes, etc. that do exist reveal that most of the archeology has occurred in the garden and not near the Paca House itself. Intact deposits relating to life in the Paca House may be preserved at the site. Furthermore, the 1990 field project revealed that intact 18th century deposits potentially are preserved to the north of the garden canal. Continued archeological monitoring of any development of these areas is still a necessity. The site still potentially holds significant archeological research potential.
