Phase I	<input checked="" type="checkbox"/>	Project Justification: This report presents the results of Phase I and Phase II archival and archeological field investigations in 1993 for the (then) proposed Convention Center Expansion in Baltimore. These investigations were requested by the Maryland Historical Trust, pursuant to Article 83B, Sections 5-617 and 5-618 of the Annotated Code of Maryland. The expansion of the Baltimore Convention Center by the Maryland Stadium Authority involved construction of expansion facilities immediately west of the existing Convention Center, on a roughly 3 acre parcel. MHT determined that, due to its location and relative lack of recent disturbance, the expansion project area retained a high potential for intact historic and prehistoric resources. Investigations focused on the southern portion of the 3 acre parcel, where the least amount of prior construction had occurred.

Project Objectives: Phase I -Develop local and site-specific contexts for understanding the prehistoric and historic occupations of the Inner Harbor area of Baltimore. -Prepare a sensitivity model for potentially significant cultural resources within the expansion project area. -Develop a research design and a program of evaluative testing for potentially significant resources. Phase II -Document the presence and integrity of historic and prehistoric resources within the project area. -Gather data necessary for determining the eligibility of those resources for listing on the NRHP. -Make management recommendations concerning those resources.
