Project Justification:

In November of 1985, the Baltimore Center for Urban Archaeology conducted salvage archeological investigations at the National Register listed Greenway Cottages of Roland Park Historic District in Baltimore. At the time, the three cottages were being restored and archeological data could potentially be destroyed. During this restoration process, the grounds located to the north of the main cottage would be disturbed by a subsurface electrical trench. This circumstance also provided an opportunity to investigate the existence of a possible "tunnel" that had been popularized by local legend.

Project Objectives:

- Obtain a cultural inventory from selected areas subjected to impact by the proposed Greenway Cottage restoration.
- Investigate the existence of a possible "tunnel" that has been popularized by local legend.
- Document any other archeological features encountered.

Research Potential:

The excavation of the Greenway Cottages site (18BC60) revealed the presence of intact deposits and features related to the late 19th century development of the area. Future development of the grounds surrounding the three cottages is not planned, but further investigations would be warranted if such activity occurred based on the likelihood that similar intact deposits exist elsewhere at the site.
