Phase II	<input checked="" type="checkbox"/>	Phase II work was conducted at the site in mid 2002 ahead of construction of a proposed new residential development. The Corps of Engineers and the Maryland Historical Trust (MHT) were asked to comment on the impact of the proposed subdivision on the nearby wetlands. The MHT also required additional archeological investigation of site 18CA81 pursuant to Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act.

<b>Project Objectives:</b> -Define the horizontal and vertical boundaries of the site -Determine the potential for finding buried intact prehistoric cultural deposits -Assess the site's eligibility for listing on the National Register of Historic Places
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### Research Potential:

The Goldsboro Watershed Survey 17 site (18CA81) represents Late Archaic and temporally undefined Woodland short-term camps, and late 19th-early 20th century artifact concentrations. The assemblage was apparently mixed (probably through plowing activity) and was restricted to the plowzone. Given the nature of the materials and in the absence of features, it was concluded that 18CA81 was not eligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places. No further work was recommended for the site.
