Project Objectives: -Evaluate the integrity and potential National Register eligibility of cultural resources present within the impact area. -Assess the significance of cultural deposits in that portion of the 18CR238 historic site to be affected by the stream relocation process. -Assess the significance of the resources potentially present in the still to be located Poulson Family Cemetery (thought to be in the area because of historic and informant data).
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Research Potential:

The resources identified during Phase II investigations suggest that 18CR238 has the potential to provide information on a number of local and regional research questions. The property is associated with the early development of Methodism in both Maryland and America. Early 19th century deposits relating to the Poulson and possibly the Nicodemus occupations could yield information to the degree to which the religious tenants of Methodism affected the daily habits of these households. On a wider scale, 18CR238 possesses the potential to address questions concerning 19th century agriculture in the Piedmont area of Maryland, and changing organization of landscape architecture of 19th century Piedmont farms.
