Phase I	<b>Project Justification:</b> Archeological fieldwork was undertaken at Union Mills (18CR166) as part of the rehabilitation of the Miller's House at the Union Mills Homestead. Researchers were concerned that the rehabilitation work, though welcome, might disturb intact archeological deposits significant to the history of Carroll County, Maryland.	<b>Project Objectives:</b> -Obtain and preserve information and material which would be destroyed during rehabilitation work at the site, particularly by a trench and drain system around three sides of the house.  -Obtain additional information on the inhabitants of the house and their way of life to assist in the interpretation of the building.  -Obtain information to enable possible reconstruction of a now demolished pantry and porch addition to the front of the building.

## Research Potential:

Only a small portion of 18CR166 was excavated. Despite the small footprint of the excavations, the work demonstrated that the site has integrity and can answer interesting questions regarding the late 18th and early 19th century German immigrants who populated this area. Additional work could also focus on the mill itself, where no excavation work has been done. Thus, Site 18CR166 has significant ongoing research potential.
