<b>Project Objectives:</b> -Identify the extent of the shell midden portion of the site. -Determine any activity areas at the site. -Locate any cultural/archeological features. -Obtain a chronological stratigraphic profile of the site.

## Research Potential:

The Holland Point Site (18DO220) is a significant prehistoric site. It represents a possible base camp with periods of occupation from the Late Archaic through the Late Woodland periods. It's location on a saltmarsh provided a unique opportunity to examine a shell midden that had not been disturbed by plowing activities. In such a case, it was possible to temporally isolate the midden deposits. In the case of Holland Point, this proved invaluable for furthering our understanding of coastal aspects of Late Woodland cultures in the Chesapeake Bay region and the Delmarva Peninsula specifically. Unfortunately, the site continues to suffer from severe erosion and in time will be lost to Slaughter Creek. The historic component of the site, however, may still provide valuable archeological data concerning the Contact period on the peninsula.
