Phase III

Project Objectives:

-Identify all historic archeological resources.

-Evaluate the research potential and significance of those resources.

-Develop appropriate recommendations for the management of significant resources.

-The Phase II study in particular was conducted in order to determine the site's eligibility for listing on the National Register of Historic Places.

Research Potential:

The Stanley Institute Site (18DO418) has and can provide information concerning the late 19th and early 20th century education of African Americans in a rural context. The archeological deposits uncovered during investigations at 18DO418 revealed or confirmed information regarding the property's users and their lifestyles. The site has contributed information concerning the historic trend of segregated African American schools during the late 19th and early 20th centuries as well as information about the community of Christ Rock. The Stanley Institute Site is an important cultural resource on the Delmarva Peninsula.
