Project Justification:

This technical report presents the results of a 2005 Phase II archeological evaluation of Site 18FR808, for the (then) proposed Cannon Bluff subdivision in Frederick County. The work was undertaken pursuant to direction from the Maryland Historical Trust regarding requirements of a Joint Federal/State Application for the Alteration of Any Floodplain, Waterway, Tidal, or Non-Tidal Wetland in Maryland for construction of the new subdivision. These studies were undertaken in compliance with Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966, as amended, and to Article 83B, Sections 5-617 and 5-618 of the Annotated Code of Maryland.

Project Objectives:

- Determine the nature, age, and function of 18FR808.
- Locate the horizontal and vertical boundaries of the site.
- Assess the integrity and information potential of the site.

Research Potential:

The prehistoric component of Site 18FR808 was found to lack vertical integrity, sufficient artifact quantities, or the diagnostic materials necessary to answer research questions related to Maryland's prehistory. The site's historic component, with the exception of a single intact but severely truncated burning pit feature, was also found to lack integrity. The site is not considered a significant archeological resource.
