## Research Potential:

Little evidence for intact prehistoric deposits has ever been recovered at 18FR39. Due to plowing and sheet erosion (and the fact that there is now a golf course sitting on top of it), the site appears to be heavily disturbed and is unlikely to yield additional information concerning Maryland prehistory.
