Project Justification:

This report presents the results of the 2004 Phase II archeological evaluation of Site 18FR796. The work was carried out due to proposed improvements to the Ijamsville Road and Bridge over Bush Creek in Frederick County. The construction entailed a significant re-alignment of Ijamsville Road and construction of a new bridge over Bush Creek. This work was undertaken in accordance with Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966, as amended, and pursuant to Article 83B, Sections 5-617 and 5-618 of the Annotated Code of Maryland.

Project Objectives:

- Determine the nature, age, and function of the site.
- Locate the horizontal and vertical boundaries of the site.
- Assess the integrity of the site.
- Define the proposed construction project's impacts to the site and provide management recommendations.

Research Potential:

Given the level of disturbance seen in the stratigraphy of Site 18FR796, discrete activity zones cannot be defined within a functional and temporal framework. Therefore, the site cannot address additional research issues related to industrial and commercial activity in Ijamsville during the period of significance for its Historic District (1831 – 1930). It is not a significant archeological resource.
