Various restoration activities were planned for the lockhouse; and because of the possible impact to cultural resources, thorough archeological investigation of the area was undertaken.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">-Locate and assess cultural resources at Lockhouse 29 and in its surrounding environs.-Gather data that can be utilized in future restoration and interpretive activities.-Locate and study the original porch foundations.-Investigate two ancillary building foundations in hopes of determining their functions and dates of occupation.

Research Potential:

The greatest potential for additional research at Site 18FR755 is in the areas immediately surrounding the lockhouse itself. The research potential in the areas of ancillary buildings and the island are largely exhausted. At a minimum, archeologists should closely monitor planned alterations to the park that will impact deposits surrounding the lockhouse.
