Phase II	<input checked="" type="checkbox"/>	This study was undertaken by the Canton Company as part of its environmental study of a tract slated for development. The tract is located north of Frederick Maryland and was developed into the Willowbrook Farms Subdivision subsequent to excavations. The sites were identified during Phase I survey and as avoidance was not possible, Phase II testing work was performed.

## Research Potential:

The Phase II archeological testing at 18FR146, 18FR703, and 18FR704 has revealed that all of the sites are small, scattered, temporary campsites probably utilized as the area was traversed by small groups. The physical boundaries of each of the sites were established and it has been determined that they all lack integrity and are not culturally significant. Little additional information would be gained through further study of the sites.
