Phase II	<input checked="" type="checkbox"/>	This report describes archeological excavations carried out between 1992 and 2008 at 18HA238, the Concord Point Lighthouse in Havre de Grace. The archeological work was carried out as part of an effort to restore the Light Keeper's Dwelling to its appearance during the period of its operation from 1827-1920. The property was purchased by the Maryland Historical Trust in 1988, and then transferred to the City of Havre de Grace. The MHT retained a perpetual easement on the house and property, and also provided grant assistance at several stages during the restoration project, and requested archeological work prior to ground disturbing activities.

Project Objectives:
-Provide evidence for an accurate restoration or reproduction of structural and other related features of the site during the period it was utilized as the light keeper's dwelling.

## Research Potential:

A significant area of potential archaeological information remains on the property at 18HA238, including features, such as a privy and well that will most probably be investigated at the appropriate time in future years. This area is at present protected by between 18 and 22 inches of modern fill. Many questions remain regarding the life and activity on and around the property during the light keeper years and there is an unbelievable absence of information during the years between 1920 and 1988, suggesting that continued archival and oral history work should be carried on to provide the fullest appreciation of this unique cultural resource, until such a time as additional archeological work seems appropriate or unavoidable.

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
