Research Potential:

Though no features were encountered at Site 18PR410, no evidence of widespread disturbance were described in the full site report. The site is likely to retain significant research potential related to the lives of African Americans at the end of the Reconstruction era in Prince George's County, especially in the area immediately surrounding the hall's foundation. The site should be considered a significant archeological resource and additional mitigation efforts should be undertaken should future construction threaten the site.
