Phase II	<input checked="" type="checkbox"/>	The site was first identified as a result of Phase Ib survey undertaken prior to a road construction project. SHA was proposing to construct an access road to restore access to the Nash Property where access had been limited by previous improvement to US 50 and MD Route 3. Phase II excavations were undertaken to evaluate the site's National Register eligibility.

Project Objectives: -Determine how far the site extends beyond the southernmost Phase I STP. -Define the site's boundary on the western side. -Sample artifact densities and stratigraphic variation across the site. -Intensively sample areas of dense artifact concentration.

Research Potential:

Phase II excavation sampled about 10% of the site 18PR464's core area. Excavation produced a good representative collection of the cultural materials likely to be found in the unexcavated portions of the the site. The site yielded useful information pertaining to themes of settlement and technology. However, because of the demonstrated vertical disturbance and mixing of temporally discrete prehistoric components, the information content of the site appears to be limited and further excavation of the site would only yield redundant data. Thus, 18PR464 should not be considered a significant archeological resource.
