Phase I archaeological investigations were conducted to study the proposed Leonardtown School and Recreation Park Project (Project) in Leonardtown, St. Mary's County. This project required consultation with the state.

### Project Objectives:

A pedestrian reconnaissance survey and subsurface testing was completed for the Phase I Archaeological Survey of the Hayden Farm Property Study Area to identify archaeological sites. The Study Area was examined for evidence of structures and/or burials as well as significant disturbances. Specifically, evidence of foundations, burial pits, grave markers – both formal and informal, vegetation associated with graveyards, artifact scatters, or trash dumps were sought. The entire Study Area was traversed and examined.

## Research Potential:

It is recommended that a Phase II level archaeological evaluation investigation be undertaken with a focus on identifying and evaluating late 18th-century through mid-19th-century occupation and activity areas as well as potential additional structures within Sites 5's western and northern portions. Such an investigation should also include an appropriate testing strategy to best determine the presence or absence of an historic cemetery component in the eastern portion of Hayden Farm Site 5.

Phase II archaeological investigations were conducted to study site Phase II archaeological investigations were conducted to study site 18ST878, which was within the proposed Leonardtown School and Recreation Park Project (Project) in Leonardtown, St. Mary's County. This project required consultation with the state.

Phase III

### Project Objectives:

The overall objective of the Phase II work was to determine if the site is significant to state, regional, and/or national cultural heritage and if it contains sufficient integrity and research value to meet the eligibility requirements for inclusion in the National Register of Historic Places (NRHP). The Phase II investigations included excavation of close-interval shovel tests and test units, and magnetometer and ground penetrating radar (GPR) investigations of a possible cemetery on the parcel.

## Research Potential:

Further archaeological investigation of site 18ST878 is unlikely to provide additional information that would enhance our understanding of site function and the general history of this area. The site was considered to have limited research value and is recommended ineligible for inclusion in the NRHP and no further archaeological investigation of the site was therefore recommended.
