Phase II

EAC Archaeology, Inc., completed the Phase II evaluation for Long Point Preserve LLC pursuant to a requirement from the Maryland Historical Trust; the proposed subdivision of Long Point Farm will require a permit from the Maryland Department of the Environment and is therefore subject to state historic preservation law.

Phase III

Project Objectives:

The Phase II effort was designed to: a) identify the vertical and horizontal boundaries of the site; b) interpret the cultural affiliations, functions, and significance of the site; c) evaluate the integrity of the site; d) conclusively determine the site's eligibility for the National Register of Historic Places; and e) define the need for further archaeological work.

## Research Potential:

Given the overall integrity of the archaeological features uncovered during the Phase II evaluation, the high possibility of intact features remaining at the site, and the relative scarcity of comparable sites in Talbot County that have yielded substantive archaeological data on the early to mid-18th century, it is felt that further investigation would be likely to uncover important information about historic life in Talbot County.
