-Subject identified sites to Phase II testing to assess their physical integrity and research significance in accordance with the establish criteria for significance.

Research Potential:

Site 18WA432 has limited physical integrity and limited intact occupation-related archeological deposits. Historical research indicated that the property was occupied from the third quarter of the 19th century through the 2nd quarter of the 20th century. The dates of the recovered artifacts coincide with these data. The relatively late date for the site, the extensive disturbance, and the low density of occupation related artifacts indicate that the Extine/Hershey Farmstead possesses little research potential or significance.
